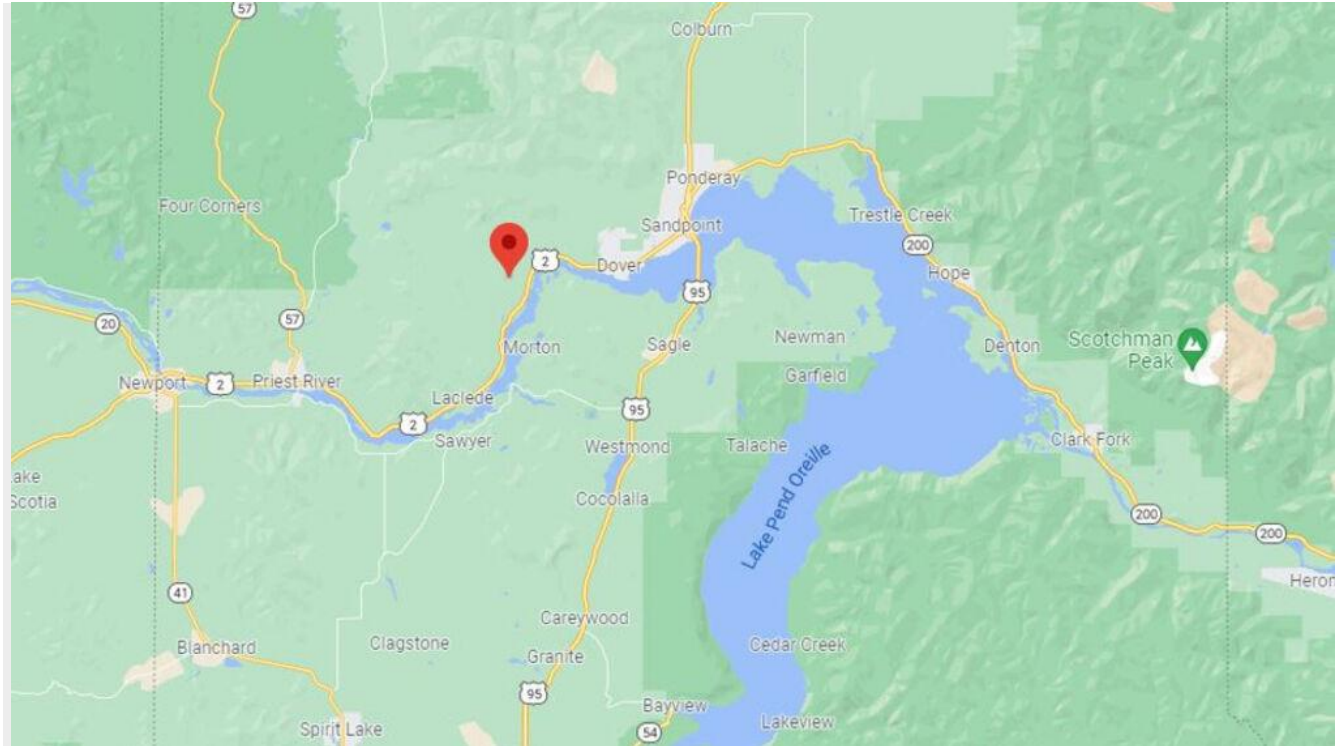


Human remains of man who went missing in 1996 found in northern Idaho

SANDPOINT, Idaho (CBS2) — Human remains of a man who went missing 25 years ago outside of Sandpoint have been identified.

The Bonner County Sheriff's Office says the remains were found last October by a logging crew in a wooded area off Wrenco Loop Road.

A few days later, officials conducted a full excavation of the area and found more human remains, clothing and a handgun. Police believe the human remains were those of Daniel Glennon, 32, who was reported missing in May of 1996. Police conducted several searches and his case remained open to this day.

Authorities were able to use dental records to confirm his identity. It's believed he died by suicide.
