Description

On July 10, 1986 an individual was found unresponsive on the sidewalk of the 2500 block of Wentworth Avenue near Live Oak Street on the south side of Houston, Texas. The individual was taken to the hospital and pronounced dead soon after arrival. Forensic investigators determined the deceased to be a Black male, 20 to 30 years old, 5'8", weighing approximately 161 lbs. with short black hair and brown eyes. The deceased was wearing women's jewelry and clothing over false breasts.
