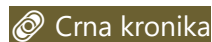


New details about the bizarre murder in Split: DNA analysis confirmed that the dismembered man was **Uroš Tičinović**. The son admitted to dismembering his father, but not to killing him!



New details have come out about the murder of **Uroš Tičinović**, an old man who was found dismembered in Split 13 years ago.

Just to remind you, [I wrote about this](#) 9 days ago. I'll quote the text of the post, mostly rephrased from the article:

What do we have? In 2012, parts of a dismembered body were found on Žnjan and Zenta - first a leg in a PVC bag, then a torso without a head and limbs, and a week later, a head wrapped in newspaper. The autopsy, as expected, showed a violent death. Specifically, it was multiple rib and clavicle fractures, the cause of death - chest injuries. Unfortunately, the identity of the victim was never established.

But, a few weeks ago, the owner of the apartment on Lučac-Manuš asked the police to check who was living in her apartment. And why? Because it was strange to her that the records still showed that a protected tenant born in 1922 was living there, who would now be 103 years old in 2025.

The police enter and find his 57-year-old son there, who had changed his name and surname, which was an immediate red flag. The son shows his father's expired ID card, and **there is no record of death** in the system. The police further discover that the father's pension had been regularly paid for 13 years, even though he wasn't there. The son then felt ill, so he ended up in the hospital, and the police are currently guarding him.

It's especially bizarre that everything was discovered only because the apartment owner suspected that the tenant, who was 103 years old, was no longer living there. If it weren't for that check, the identity of the headless body might never have been discovered. Considering the manner of the murder and this concealment of evidence, the perpetrator definitely deserves a life sentence. The overlap suggests that it is indeed the father, but the final confirmation of the analysis is awaited.

Yesterday, a new [article](#) came out in SD, which mentions that the DNA analysis showed that the dismembered deceased from Zenta was Uroš Tičinović, and the son who continued to receive his pension was arrested for the aggravated murder of his father and the dismemberment of the body!

The son recently finished *treatment*, and was questioned by the police, so SD released another [article](#) today. Since paywalled articles aren't shared, I'll rephrase this one too.

The murderer's name is **Borna Tudor**, and his real name (before the change) was **Mladen Tičinović**, and he is currently 57 years old. He ended up in Bilice (in the Split prison) after being charged with the murder of his father for profit and fraud against HZMO. The police claim that he **hit his father multiple times with a blunt object**, broke his ribs and clavicle, and then dismembered the body and took the parts to Žnjan.

After his father's death, he continued to live in the apartment on Držićeve (in which his father was a protected tenant, **and it's worth remembering that this right is not inheritable!**), regularly received his father's pension and paid the bills, creating the impression that his father was still alive. The police say that he thus benefited by almost 79 thousand euros.

In his defense, he denied the murder - he claims that his father fell, that he cared for him and fed him until his death, and when he died in the toilet (he saw him sitting with his head hanging down with his eyes closed), he allegedly panicked and **dismembered the body with a saw** and got rid of it. He also said that his excuses to the postmen and neighbors (that his father was sleeping or was in the hospital) allowed him to hide the truth for years.

The judge sent him to investigative detention due to the risk of repeating the crime, and the ŽDO is conducting an investigation for the aggravated murder of a particularly vulnerable person (and the penalty for this is a maximum of 40 years in prison). The pathologist expert claims that the injuries could not have been caused by a fall, but by blows, so the theories about natural death, or rather an unfortunate accident, fall apart.

I'll repeat, I'm still glad that the owner once thought to check who was actually living in her apartment, and that's actually where it all started. And this guy deserves a life sentence, nothing else.
